

Miami-Dade County Public Schools Hazardous Walk Area Review Request

Steps for requesting a hazardous review:

- 1. Schools will need to complete this form and submit to the M-DCPS, Department of Transportation using BusPlannerWorkflow.
- 2. DOT will review whether the area is within 2 miles (walking distance) and if there is "Space Available" on any existing bus routes.
- 3. If the criteria are not met the Division of Safety and Emergency Management will review and analyze alternative options.
